Research and the Teaching Profession: Building the Capacity for a Self-Improving Education System In May 2014, BERA and the Royal Society for the Arts (RSA) published the concluding report of their 18-month Inquiry into the relationship between educational research and teaching. This was partly a response to current policy moves in many countries to undermine the position of university led teacher education. These moves are (or should be) a source of considerable concern, not only for university based teacher educators, but for the whole educational research community. The BERA-RSA Inquiry was established with the aim of bringing together the international evidence on the contribution of research to all forms of teacher education. The final report recommended that teachers should be supported to become research literate. This should include being given frequent opportunities to read up on the latest findings, with every pupil entitled to lessons which are informed by the best evidence. The inquiry lays down 10 principles for self-improving and research-rich education systems, and 20 recommendations, embracing both teacher education and teachers' professional development once in the job.

This symposium presents key findings from that Inquiry, findings that have major implications for teacher education and for the wider research community.

DfE Chief Analyst and Chief Scientific Adviser, Professor Tim Leunig, will speak about how the department wants to engage with the academic community.

In May 2013 the Department for Education published the results of its Analytical Review which looked at the role of research, analysis and data in the DfE, English schools and children's services. The Department wants to raise standards, narrow the gap, and protect the vulnerable. We believe that we can best do this if:

- 1) the Department becomes more evidence driven
- 2) schools and others become more evidence driven
- 3) schools and others become more involved in generating the evidence base

To that end we published a set of research priority papers. We particularly want to hear from academics who are working in these areas. This does not mean we are uninterested in other research, but this does set out areas that are of particular importance at present.

We are also keen to involve academics in other ways. We will continue to commission research from academics and other organisations from time to time. We have also created an academic panel, of academics willing and able to do short pieces of work on very specific topics. This replaces the research centres. We hope that this approach will be more open and more inclusive, and will be more flexible.

I see this session as a means to hear from you about your perceptions of the strengths and weaknesses of our approach to research and dissemination. I want to know how you think we can be more effective at harnessing your knowledge and expertise to deliver the objectives that we share for children in our country.

A context of increasing school accountability, driven by publicly accessible results from high-stakes national testing, has amplified the improvement agenda in Australian schools. A number of studies have highlighted the potential risks associated with high-stakes assessment (Klenowski, 2009) and the possibility of 'perverse effects of secondary uses of assessment evidence' (O'Neill, 2013 p. 6). Few studies, however, explore how school leaders perceive and navigate the issues around the use of ethical and inclusive practices in this climate of surveillance and accountability (Blackmore, 2010).

This presentation will present an overview of the ARC Linkage project which aims to investigate how school principals and teachers engage in ethical leadership practices Starratt (1996, 2004) to promote equity and improved learning outcomes for all students in their schools. Working with six schools in Queensland, we will explore the ethical principles and practices that are being used to promote inclusion and equity within the schools, in their communities and in collaboration with other educators.

The study draws upon a critical approach and evidence based inquiry to support schools to interrogate their data and move towards improvement. A key part of the study is the establishment of networks between and amongst schools where schools in the study will work with a new local school to exchange their expertise and resources. The study is based on the central tenet that schools that are successful in improving all students' learning do so by developing an inclusive organisational culture that values and respects all members of the school community (Carrington, 1999; Dyson et al, 2002). The purpose of this presentation is to provide an overview of our study, including the theoretical frame and methodology.
